**THE TRADE AGREEMENT (UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST
REPUBLICS) ORDER 1963**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 1st day of August 1963

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5 of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, as amended by subsection (3) of section 11 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Trade Agreement (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) Order 1963.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1963.

2. The duties and exemptions from duty provided for in accordance with the Most Favoured Nation Tariff set out in the Customs Tariff, being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961, as from time to time modified (whether before or after the commencement of this order), are hereby applied to goods being the produce or manufacture of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

3. Subject to the provisions of the Cook Islands Customs Duties Order 1962* (as from time to time modified, whether before or after the commencement of this order), this order shall be in force in the Cook Islands.

4. The provisions of this order shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.

5. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order applies the Most Favoured Nation Tariff to goods imported into New Zealand from the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and extends this treatment to such goods imported into the Cook Islands.
