



**THE TRAFFIC CONTROL CORPS EMERGENCY
REGULATIONS 1943**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 13th day of
January, 1943.

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Traffic Control Corps Emergency Regulations 1943.

2. (1) The Minister of Transport may issue or may authorize the issue of a warrant of appointment as a traffic inspector under these regulations to any member of the Traffic Control Corps of the Home Guard.

(2) Every warrant of appointment issued under these regulations shall have written or stamped thereon the words "Traffic Control Corps of the Home Guard."

(3) Any warrant duly issued pursuant to Regulation 23 of the Emergency Reserve Corps Regulations 1941* and in force on the coming into force of these regulations shall be deemed to have been issued pursuant to and for the purposes of these regulations.

3. Every member of the Traffic Control Corps while carrying his warrant of appointment and on Home Guard duty may, if in uniform or wearing any distinctive Traffic Control Corps badge, armlet, or insignia, exercise any power or authority conferred upon a Traffic Inspector appointed in terms of the Traffic Regulations 1936†, and shall while so acting be deemed to be a traffic inspector so appointed.
