**THE TRAINING COLLEGE REGULATIONS, 1926,  
AMENDMENT NO. 14.**

Enacting authority : His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.  
Act pursuant to which the regulations were made : The Education Act, 1914, and all other powers enabling in that behalf.

Date on which the regulations were made : 30th day of November, 1936.

Date of notification in *Gazette* : 3rd day of December, 1936.

**REGULATIONS.**

**1.** These regulations may be cited as the Training College Regulations, 1926, Amendment No. 14.

**2.** These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made by Order in Council dated 13th December, 1926\* (hereinafter called "the principal regulations"), as amended from time to time by the amending regulations referred to in the Schedule hereto.

**3.** These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1936.

**4.** Clause 8 of the principal regulations is amended by adding thereto the following subclause :—

"(5) For the reasonable travelling-expenses of the principal and head teacher or ex-head teacher while acting as members of the Selection Committee such grants as are approved by the Minister."

**5.** Clauses 9 to 14 of the principal regulations (as amended) are revoked, and the following substituted :—

"9. (1) Subject to the approval of the Minister, students may be admitted to a teachers' training college in Division A, Division B, Division C, and Division D.

"(2) (a) Applicants for admission as students of Division A, Division C, or Division D shall address their applications not later than the 1st November to the Education Board of the district in which their home or usual place of residence is situated :

"(b) Applicants for admission as students of Division B shall address their applications not later than the 1st November to the Director of Education, who shall forward approved applications to the Education Board controlling the training college.

“(3) Applicants for admission as students of Division A or Division C may submit their applications in anticipation of their obtaining the necessary academic qualifications by the time the training college opens.

“(4) Applications for admission as training-college students shall, in respect to the numbers to be admitted under the various divisions from each education district, and in respect to the training college to which the applicants are to be admitted, be dealt with as the Minister may direct.

“(5) In each education district there shall be a Selection Committee, consisting of the Senior Inspector of Schools and two other persons chosen annually by the Education Board from the following: The members of the Board, the Secretary of the Board, the Principal of the training college, and head teachers or ex-head teachers of primary schools.

“(6) The Selection Committee shall consider all the applications received by the Board for admission to the training colleges in Division A and Division C, and shall advise the Board of the order of merit of the applicants.

“(7) The Education Board shall admit to the training college in Division A and Division C only those applicants recommended for admission by the Selection Committee. The Board shall admit only up to the number approved by the Minister under subclause (4) hereof and in the order recommended by the Selection Committee.

“(8) No applicant shall be selected for admission to a training college unless—

“(a) He is at least seventeen years of age on the 31st December preceding the date of the reopening of the training college; and

“(b) He satisfies the Selection Committee that he is of good character and reputation; and

“(c) He satisfies a School Medical Officer that he is free from any physical or other defect incompatible with efficiency as a teacher. Any applicant who is dissatisfied with the decision of a School Medical Officer as to the applicant's medical fitness for the teaching service shall have the right to appeal to the Director of the Division of School Hygiene who, on receiving such an appeal, shall arrange for a further medical examination to be conducted by one or more medical officers appointed by the Director-General of Health for this purpose. Travelling or other expenses incurred by an applicant in attending such further medical examination shall be borne by the applicant; and

“(d) In the case of a student of Division A or Division C, he satisfies the Selection Committee of his suitability for the work of teaching.

“(9) The names of those applicants who have been approved as students of Division A and Division C by the Education Board of any district in which there is no training college shall be forwarded by the

Board to the Board controlling the training college, together with any comments or recommendations the Selection Committee of the former Board sees fit to make.

“ 10. (1) Students of Division A shall be admitted to a teachers' training college for a period of two years and students of Division C for a period of one year, but in special cases such period may be extended for a further year by the Director. Students of Division B and Division D shall be admitted for such period not exceeding two years as may be approved by the Director.

“ (2) At the end of his training-college course of one, two, or three years, as the case may be, a student of Division A, C, or D may be required to complete his training by serving for one year as a probationary assistant.

“ (3) The Senior Inspector shall, after consultation with the Principal, recommend to each Education Board the probationary assistants who should be selected and attached to schools in accordance with the regulations for the staffing of public schools.

*“ Studentships of Division A.*

“ 11. (1) To be admitted in Division A an applicant must have obtained a pass or a partial pass in the Training College Entrance Examination, or have obtained some other qualification approved by the Director.

“ (2) The allowance payable to a student shall be at the rate of £70 per annum, together with such amount as may be approved by the Minister towards the payment of the fees of the University college classes attended by the student with the approval of the Director.

“ (3) A student who is obliged to live away from his home or usual place of residence in order to attend a training college shall be paid a further £30 per annum as boarding-allowance.

“ (4) (a) A student who shows to the satisfaction of the Director that he is obliged to live away from his home or usual place of residence in order to attend a training college shall be paid one return fare annually between the training college and his home or usual place of residence :

Provided that a student who is required by the Director to attend a training college other than the training college nearer to his home or usual place of residence may, in the event of his returning to his home or usual place of residence during a short vacation, be paid in addition, but not more than twice in any year, a return fare equal to the difference between the fares to the nearer training college and the fares to the more distant college.

“ (b) A student who is not obliged to live away from his home or usual place of residence in order to attend a training college may in any year be paid towards the minimum cost of travelling more than three miles each way between his home or usual place of residence and the training college by a route approved by the Director the amount up to a maximum of £10 by which his actual and reasonable travelling-expenses exceed £4.

“(c) A student who is required by the Principal to attend a school for observation of and practice in teaching methods shall be paid such amount as the Director may approve towards actual and reasonable travelling-expenses thereby incurred.

“(5) (a) No allowance shall be payable to a student for any period during which he has been in receipt of salary or allowance as a teacher or student teacher.

“(b) No University college fees shall be paid in respect of any classes at which a student's attendance and progress have not been satisfactory, and if such fees have been paid the amount shall be deducted from any allowances due to him or be otherwise recoverable from him by the Board.

*“Studentships of Division B.*

“12. To be admitted in Division B an applicant must have obtained some educational qualification approved by the Director. A student admitted in this Division shall pay into the Public Account fees amounting to £7 7s. per term within seven days after the commencement of each term, failing which attendance must be discontinued.

*“Studentships of Division C.*

“13. (1) To be admitted in Division C an applicant must be a graduate of a recognized University, or have, as a matriculated student, satisfactorily completed a three years' course in agriculture or home science at a college recognized by the University of New Zealand, or have obtained some other educational qualification that in the opinion of the Director is equivalent thereto.

“(2) The allowances and fees payable to or on behalf of a student in Division C shall be at the same rate and subject to the same conditions as for a student in Division A.

*“Short-period Studentships, Division D.*

“14. (1) To be admitted in Division D an applicant must—

“(a) Have obtained a pass or a partial pass in the Training College Entrance Examination, or have obtained some other educational qualification that in the opinion of the Director is equivalent thereto :

“(b) Have been for such period as may be approved by the Director regularly employed in teaching in a registered school or schools :

“(c) Have been approved for training by the Director of Education.

“(2) The course of a student of Division D shall be for such period as the Director, on the advice of the Senior Inspector, shall determine, and shall be wholly professional or partly academic and partly professional as the Senior Inspector may recommend.

“(3) The allowances and fees payable to or on behalf of a student of Division D shall be at the same rate and subject to the same conditions as those for a first-year student of Division A.”
