



**THE TROUT-FISHING (SOUTH CANTERBURY) REGULATIONS  
1936, AMENDMENT NO. 4**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 20th day of  
September, 1944

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (South Canterbury) Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 4.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Trout-fishing (South Canterbury) Regulations 1936\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1944.

4. Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting, after item (a) thereof, the following additional item:—

“(aa) Any wood grub (Hu Hu); or”.

5. The principal regulations are amended by inserting, next after Regulation 10 thereof, the following additional regulation:—

“10A. No person shall within the said district on any one day take or kill more than twelve trout, and no person shall continue to fish for trout on any day on which he has already taken or killed within the said district twelve trout.”
