PURSUANT to section 7 of the Tariff Act 1988, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Tariff (Less Developed Countries and Least Developed Countries) Order 1989, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Tariff (Less Developed Countries and Least Developed Countries) Order 1989* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1990.

2. Less Developed Countries—The First Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by inserting, in their appropriate alphabetical order, the following countries:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 July 1990, reinstates for tariff purposes as less developed countries under New Zealand's country graduation policy, the countries known as Libya, Oman, and Saudi Arabia.
