ORDER IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 7 of the Tariff Act 1988, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Tariff (Less Developed Countries and Least Developed Countries) Order 1993, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Tariff (Less Developed Countries and Least Developed Countries) Order 1993* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1994.

2. Taiwan to cease to be a less developed country—It is hereby declared that, on the coming into force of this order, Taiwan (Province of China) shall cease to be a less developed country for the purposes of the Tariff Act 1988.

3. First Schedule amended—The First Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by omitting the reference to Taiwan (Province of China).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order removes the benefit of less developed country tariff status for Taiwan with effect from 1 January 1994.

From that date, Taiwanese exports to New Zealand will no longer qualify for preferential treatment under the Tariff Act 1988.
