**THE TROUT-FISHING (SOUTH CANTERBURY) REGULATIONS
1936, AMENDMENT NO. 3.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 1st day of
October, 1941.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (South Canterbury) Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 3.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Trout-fishing (South Canterbury) Regulations 1936* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following regulation substituted :—

“ 13. No person shall use any bait other than artificial fly when fishing for trout or other acclimatized fish in—

“ (a) The water known as Horseshoe Lagoon, Seadown :

“ (b) The Ohape Creek :

“ (c) The tributaries of the Ohape Creek.”
