ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 1st day of March 1977

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Tokelau Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Tokelau Finance Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Tokelau Finance Regulations 1967* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Power of Administrator to authorise expenditure—(1) Regulation 12 of the principal regulations, as amended by section 7 (1) of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, is hereby further amended by omitting the expression “\$2,000” in each place where it appears, and substituting in each case the expression “\$30,000”.

(2) The said regulation 12 is hereby further amended by adding the following subclause:

“(3) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this regulation, the Administrator may, without further authority, authorise unforeseen expenditure up to a limit of \$10,000 in any year.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations extend the authority of the Administrator to authorise expenditure of a capital nature, and empower him to authorise unforeseen expenditure up to a limit of \$10,000 in any year.
