THE TRANSPORT LICENSING EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1940, AMENDMENT NO. 2.

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 1st day of October, 1941.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Transport Licensing Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Transport Licensing Emergency Regulations 1940.*

2. If after reviewing a passenger-service license or a goods-service license under section 8 of the Transport Licensing Amendment Act, 1936, or clause 18 of the applied provisions of the Transport (Goods) Order 1936, t as the case may be, and having regard to the existence of a state of war between His Majesty and the Government of the German Reich, the proper Licensing Authority is of the opinion that it is necessary or desirable in the public interest so to do, it may suspend the license.

3. Every such suspension, whether made before or after the commencement of these regulations, shall be for a period ending on the first quarter-day (as defined in section 2 (2) of the Transport Licensing Act, 1931) following the termination of the said state of war, or for a period ending on such earlier date as may be specified by the Licensing Authority either at the time of the suspension or at any time or from time to time thereafter. The period of suspension of any license may extend beyond the date at which the license is expressed to expire.

4. During the period of suspension of any license as aforesaid the service authorized by the license shall not be carried on, but nevertheless the license, unless sooner revoked, shall continue in force throughout the period of suspension and thereafter until the first quarter-day following the expiry of that period or until the date at which the license is expressed to expire, whichever is the later.
