

# THE TRANSPORT (DRIVERS LICENSING) REGULATIONS 1985, AMENDMENT NO. 1

# HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 29F and 199 of the Transport Act 1962, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Transport (Drivers Licensing) Regulations 1985, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Transport (Drivers Licensing) Regulations 1985\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- **2. Use of interpreters**—(1) Regulation 12 (3) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, before the words "The tests", the words "Except as provided in subclause (4) of this regulation,".

(2) Regulation 12 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding

the following subclauses:

"(4) The Minister may approve persons to act as interpreters in the conduct of tests for Class AM, Class AP, Class AR, Class A, and Class B licences, and any such person who is approved in respect of a language

chosen by an applicant for any such licence may conduct the tests in conjunction with a testing officer if the testing officer is satisfied that the applicant does not sufficiently understand the English language.

ti(5) Where any applicant wishes to have an interpreter involved in the conduct of any test it shall be the responsibility of the applicant to select and arrange the attendance and remuneration (if any) of an appropriate approved interpreter."

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide for the use of interpreters in the conduct of tests for certain driving licences. The licences are those that relate to mopeds, motorcycles, private motorcars, and light trade vehicles. An interpreter approved by the Minister can take part in the conduct of the test where the testing officer is satisfied that the applicant for the licence does not sufficiently understand the English language.

An applicant who wishes to use an interpreter must arrange for the interpreter's attendance and remuneration, and is entitled to select any appropriate interpreter approved by the Minister

of Transport.
