**THE TRANSPORT LEGISLATION SUSPENSION ORDER 1941.**

PURSUANT to the Transport Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940,\* the Minister of Transport doth hereby order and declare as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Transport Legislation Suspension Order 1941.

2. In this Order the term “road” means any public road, and includes a street.

3. The provisions of section 11 of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, are hereby suspended so far as they require the payment of annual license fees in respect of any tractor or any trailer drawn by a tractor if the vehicle (a) is owned by a person carrying on business as a farmer and is used exclusively in connection with the owner’s farming business, and (b) is used on roads only for the cartage of lime or other fertilizer or for those purposes and for agricultural purposes, and (c) is taken during any one trip for the above-mentioned purposes along less than thirteen miles of road in going from the owner’s farm or other place of garage and in returning thereto.
