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REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Trade Marks (Border Protection and Transitional Applications) Amendment Regulations 1999, and are part of the Trade Marks (Border Protection and Transitional Applications) Regulations 1994* (“the principal regulations”).

(2) These regulations come into force on 1 July 1999.

2. Fee removed—Regulation 9 of the principal regulations is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1999, remove from the Trade Marks (Border Protection and Transitional Applications) Regulations 1994 the \$50 fee previously payable on the giving of a notice under section 23 (2) of the Trade Marks Amendment Act 1994.
