## THE TRADE MARKS REGULATIONS 1954, AMENDMENT NO. 1

#### HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Trade Marks Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Trade Marks Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Trade Marks Regulations 1954\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. (1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking items 7 and 8, and substituting the following items:

- (2) This regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1967.
- 3. (1) The fee payable in respect of any renewal of the registration of a trade mark pursuant to regulation 52 of the principal regulations shall be the fee that would have been payable if regulation 2 of these regulations had not come into force in any case where the application for renewal has been made and the fee paid before the date of the notification of these regulations in the Gazette.
- (2) Subject to subclause (1) of this regulation, where the current period of registration of any trade mark expires on or after the 1st day of April 1967, the fee payable in respect of the renewal of the registration shall be the fee that would have been payable if regulation 2 of these regulations had come into force before the making of the application for renewal and the payment of the fee.
- 4. Where any doubt or uncertainty arises as to whether any fee for the renewal of the registration of a trade mark that is payable pursuant to section 29 of the Trade Marks Act 1953 on or before the 31st day of March 1969 is payable at the higher rate payable after the commencement of regulation 2 of these regulations or at the lower rate payable before the commencement of that regulation, the Commissioner may, if he thinks fit, accept payment at the lower rate in full satisfaction of the fee payable.
- 5. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from form 14 the expression "renewal fee of £5", and substituting the expression "prescribed renewal fee".

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the renewal fees prescribed by the First Schedule of the principal regulations.
