## Order

#### 1 Title

This order is the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Special Exemptions Extension) Order 2007.

#### 2 Commencement

This order comes into force on 1 May 2007.

# 3 Extension of special exemptions

The exemption period referred to in sections 81 and 82(1) of the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997 is extended for a period of 12 months, from the beginning of 1 May 2007 to the close of 30 April 2008, in relation to the laws, and the provisions of the laws, specified or described in Schedule 3 of that Act.

## **Explanatory note**

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order comes into force on 1 May 2007. The order extends, for 12 months, the exemptions of certain laws from the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997. The exemptions would otherwise expire on the close of 30 April 2007. The extension applies to all the laws listed in Schedule 3 of the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997.
