PUBLIC TRUST OFFICE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 1st day of
October, 1941.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Trust Office Emergency Regulations 1941.

2. These regulations shall apply to the estate of any member of any of His Majesty's naval, military, or air forces, whether raised in New Zealand or elsewhere, who has died out of New Zealand while a member of any of those forces, whether before or after the commencement of these regulations, if—

- (a) Being a member of any of those forces on the 2nd day of September, 1939, he ordinarily resided in New Zealand either on that date or immediately before becoming a member of any of those forces; or
- (b) Not being a member of any of those forces on the 2nd day of September, 1939, he ordinarily resided or carried on business in New Zealand immediately before becoming a member of any of those forces, whether before or after the commencement of these regulations.

3. Where any estate to which these regulations apply is under administration by the Public Trustee, it shall be a sufficient compliance with the provisions of section 50 of the Public Trust Office Act, 1908, as to the publication of notices, if the notice referred to in that section is published in the locality in New Zealand where the deceased last ordinarily resided or carried on business, and the time limited in the notice for the sending in of claims against the estate may be such period, not being less than one month from the first publication of the notice, as the Public Trustee shall determine.
