THE TIMBER PRESERVATION REGULATIONS 1955,
AMENDMENT NO. 3

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 24th day of April 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Industries and Commerce Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Timber Preservation Regulations 1955, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Timber Preservation Regulations 1955* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Administration of principal regulations—(1) Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the definition of the term “Minister”, and substituting the following definition:
“ ‘Minister’ means the Minister of Forests:”.

(2) Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “Department of Industries and Commerce”, and substituting the words “New Zealand Forest Service”.

3. Penalty for offences—Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (2) the words “and shall be liable accordingly to the penalties specified in section 30 of the Board of Trade Act 1919”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of regulation 2 is to transfer the administration of the principal regulations from the Minister of Industries and Commerce to the Minister of Forests.

Regulation 3 is consequential on the provisions of the new regulation 13 of the principal regulations (substituted by Amendment No. 1), which now prescribes the penalty for offences.
