THE TRANSPORT (DEMERIT POINTS) REGULATIONS 1985

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 20th day of May 1985

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 51 and 199 of the Transport Act 1962, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Transport (Demerit Points) Regulations 1985.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of June 1985.

2. Demerit points—(1) Subject to subclause (2) of this regulation, the number of demerit points to be recorded by the Secretary in respect of any person convicted of an offence described in the Schedule to these regulations that was committed on or after the 1st day of June 1985 shall be the number of demerit points shown in the final column of that Schedule in relation to the offence.

(2) No demerit points shall be recorded in respect of any offence for which the defendant is disqualified from holding or obtaining a driver's licence for a period of 3 months or more.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe the demerit points to be recorded in relation to various offences relating to motor vehicles committed on or after 1 June 1985. Sections 44 to 48 of the Transport Act 1962 set out the consequences for a driver of having demerit points recorded against him.
