THE TROUT-FISHING (AUCKLAND) REGULATIONS, 1936.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. Act pursuant to which the regulations were made : The Fisheries Act, 1908.

Date on which the regulations were made: 9th day of September, 1936.

Date of notification in Gazette: 17th day of September, 1936.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (Auckland) Regulations, 1936.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations for the Auckland Acclimatization District and the waters thereof made on the 31st day of August, 1931* (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

3. The regulations made in amendment of the principal regulations on the 3rd day of September, 1934, † and the 28th day of August, 1935, t are hereby revoked.

4. The principal regulations are amended by deleting the word "Schedule" wherever it occurs and substituting the words "First Schedule."

5. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended) is revoked, and the following substituted :-

"3. On and after the 1st day of October, 1936, no person shall take trout by any means whatsoever in any of the following rivers or streams or parts of rivers or streams, namely :--

" The Mangare River.

" The Waitete River.

" The Puriri River.

"The Little Waipa River from Pearce's Falls to its mouth.

"The tributaries of the Little Waipa River."

6. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended) is revoked, and the following substituted :--

"7. (a) No person shall in fishing for trout use any bait or lure other than the natural fly, artificial fly, natural minnow, artificial minnow, or any small indigenous fish, insect, grasshopper, beetle, or spider, the use of which is not otherwise prohibited.

"(b) No person shall in fishing for trout use shellfish, fish-ova, koura, houhou or matai grub, or earthworms.

"(c) No person shall in fishing for trout in any of the rivers specified in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto use any bait or lure other than a bait or lure specified against the name of that river in Column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto."

7. Regulation 13 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended) is revoked, and the following substituted :—

"13. Every person taking a trout which does not exceed 12 in. in length from tip of nose to tip of tail shall immediately return it alive with as little damage or hurt as possible into the waters from which it was taken."

8. The principal regulations are amended by adding thereto the following Second Schedule :---

Waikato (between the dam and the lower end of the tail-race at Horahora Works), Pokaiwhenua, Lake Arapuni (from the head of the lake to a point 80 chains above the dam), Moakurarua (downstream from its junction with the Oamaru Stream), Awakino, Little Waipa and its tributaries, Mangatutu, Owairaka	Artificial fly, artificial minnow, and spoon.
Waipa River above its junction with the Waitomo Stream	Natural fly, artificial fly, artificial minnow, and spoon.
Waipa River (below its junction with the Waitomo), Waitomo, Mangapu, Mangaorongo (below O'Briens Bridge), Ongarue (below Waimiha Railway-station), Waikato (downstream from the lower end of the tail-race at Horahora Works)	Natural fly, artificial fly, natural minnow, arti- ficial minnow, and spoon.
Waiomo and Whakauru Streams	Artificial fly and spoon.
