THE TROUT-FISHING (BULLER) REGULATIONS, 1936.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. Act pursuant to which the regulations were made: The Fisheries Act, 1908.

Date on which the regulations were made: 9th day of September, 1936.

Date of notification in Gazette: 17th day of September, 1936.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (Buller) Regulations, 1936.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations for the Buller Acclimatization District and the waters thereof made on the 20th day of April, 1931* (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").
- **3.** Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—
- "11. (a) No person shall in fishing for trout or other acclimatized fish use with any line or bait any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.
- "(b) No person shall fish for, take or kill, trout or other acclimatized fish with, or use for the purpose of taking or killing any such fish, any cross-line or hand-line fishing, stroke-hauling, rifle or other firearm, or any other unsportsmanlike device."
- 4. Regulation 17 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—
- "17. (a) The penalty for any breach of Regulations 6, 7, and 8 hereof shall be (in addition to the penalty imposed by Regulation 16 hereof) a fine of not less than £10 nor more than £50.
- "(b) The penalty for fishing for taking or killing trout or other acclimatized fish with, or using for the purpose of taking or killing any such fish, any rifle or other firearm shall be (in addition to the penalty imposed by Regulation 16 hereof) a fine of not less than £10 nor more than £50.
- "(c) The penalty for any other breach of these regulations shall be a fine of not less than £2 nor more than £50."
