## THE TRAFFIC REGULATIONS 1936, AMENDMENT NO. 11

PURSUANT to the Transport Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Traffic Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 11, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Traffic Regulations 1936\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- **2.** Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:—
- "(6) Every person to whom any direction is given pursuant to this regulation shall comply with that direction, and no person shall do any act which is for the time being forbidden pursuant to this regulation:
- "Provided that no person shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this subclause unless the Court is satisfied that the police officer or traffic inspector had reasonable grounds for believing that in all the circumstances of the case the direction or prohibition was necessary in the interests of the safety of the driver or rider or person in charge of the vehicle or of any other person or of the public."

**3.** (1) Regulation 21 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:—

"(2) No person shall ride any bicycle during hours of darkness

unless-

"(a) It is equipped with a lamp which is placed at the back of the bicycle so as to display and does display to the rear a red light of sufficient brilliance to be visible under normal atmospheric conditions for a distance of at least 300 ft.; and

"(b) It is equipped with a red reflector of a make and type which is approved by the Minister by notice published in the Gazette, and which is placed perpendicularly at the back of the bicycle so as to reflect to the rear and does reflect to the rear a light shining towards it from rearward of the bicycle."

(2) This regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of May

1953.

**4.** Regulation 7 of the principal regulations (as enacted by regulation 3 of the Traffic Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 9) is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (1) the words "clause (11)", and substituting the words "clause (16)".

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

Regulation 2 imposes an obligation on all persons to comply with any direction given by a police officer or traffic inspector under regulation 3 of the principal regulations and to refrain from doing any act prohibited by a police officer or traffic inspector under that regulation. In any prosecution for a breach of this provision the Court must be satisfied that the police officer or traffic inspector had reasonable grounds for believing that the direction or prohibition was necessary in the interests of road safety.

Regulation 3, which comes into force on 1 May 1953, requires all bicycles ridden during hours of darkness to be equipped with both a red tail light and a red

rear reflector.

Regulation 4 corrects an incorrect reference in regulation 7 (1) of the principal regulations.
