At the Government House at Wellington, this 21st day of September, 1938.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (South Canterbury) Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 2.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Trout-fishing (South Canterbury) Regulations 1936* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1938.
- 4. Paragraph (a) of Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following paragraph substituted—
 - "(a) Any multiple-hooked fly."
- 5. The principal regulations are amended by inserting therein next following after Regulation 8 thereof the following additional regulation:—
- "8a. No person shall in fishing for trout or other acclimatized fish in the said district use any silvery or bully tackle—
 - "(a) With hooks other than single or triple hooks:
 - "(b) Having more than one set of triple hooks of a size greater than No. 4:
 - "(c) Having more than two single hooks in conjunction with a set of triple hooks:
 - "(d) Having any single hook larger than size No. 5 if used in conjunction with a set of triple hooks:

- "(e) Having any set of triple hooks tied otherwise than below all single hooks:
- "(f) Having three single hooks any one of which is larger than size No. 5:
- "(g) Having more than one lure or bait attached to the line or trace."
- 6. Regulation 16 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—
- "16. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £50."
