THE TRAFFIC REGULATIONS 1936, AMENDMENT NO. 5

Pursuant to the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Traffic Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 5.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the Traffic Regulations 1936* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the date of notification hereof in the $\it Gazette$.
- 4. (1) No person or driver in charge of any vehicle having more than two road wheels shall stop, stand, or park such vehicle, whether attended or unattended, in any part of a roadway within a parking zone in respect of which signs are maintained by a controlling authority indicating that the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles within that parking zone is prohibited, limited, or restricted, except in conformity with the terms of any such limitation or restriction.

- (2) For the purposes of this regulation, "parking zone" means a parking zone in which general parking restrictions are in operation pursuant to approval of the Minister given under clause (4A) of the Traffic Sign Regulations 1937,* as the said clause (4A) is enacted by Regulation 5 of the Traffic Sign Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 1; and "maintained" means erected and maintained in conformity with subclause (b) of the said clause (4A).
- 5. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding next following clause (3), the following clause:—
- "(3A) No person shall operate a motor-vehicle unless the steeringgear and associated mechanism is in safe and efficient working condition."
