# ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 6th day of October, 1938.

## Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

#### PRELIMINARY.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (Auckland) Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 1.
- 2. Terms used herein shall have the same meaning as in the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1936\* (hereinafter referred to as the general regulations).
- 3. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Trout-fishing (Auckland) Regulations 1937.†
- 4. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1938.
- ${\bf 5.}$  Column 1 of the Second Schedule to the principal regulations is amended as follows:—
  - (i) By inserting, after the word "spillway", the following words "and including the head race".
  - (ii) By revoking the words "(between the dam and the lower end of the tail race at Horahora Works)", and substituting the following words "from the power-house and foot of the spillway at Arapuni to the Horahora spillway and power-house".
  - (iii) By revoking the words "Horahora Works to the dam and spillway", and substituting the following words "the Horahora spillway and power-house to its mouth".

- 6. Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation 33 of the general regulations, there shall be paid and taken for licenses issued under the general regulations by the Auckland Acclimatization Society the respective fees set out in the fourth, fifth, and sixth columns of the Schedule hereto.
- 7. Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation 12 of the general regulations, the holder of a whole-season license issued by any authority other than the Auckland Acclimatization Society may fish for, take, and kill any species of acclimatized fish in the Auckland Acclimatization District only if such holder has produced his license to the Auckland Acclimatization Society and paid to the Auckland Acclimatization Society the difference between the fee for such license prescribed by the general regulations and the fee for the issue by the Auckland Acclimatization Society of a whole-season license prescribed by these regulations.
- 8. Nothing in the last preceding regulation shall apply to a whole-season license issued under the Rotorua Trout-fishing Regulations 1929 or the Taupo Trout-fishing Regulations 1929.
