**THE TROUT-FISHING (AUCKLAND) REGULATIONS 1937,
AMENDMENT NO. 2.**

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 30th day of August, 1939.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

PRELIMINARY.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (Auckland) Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 2.

2. Terms used herein shall have the same meaning as in the Fresh-water Fisheries Regulations 1936 (hereinafter referred to as the general regulations).

3. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Trout-fishing (Auckland) Regulations 1937* (hereinafter called the principal regulations) and the amendment thereof.

4. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1939.

5. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations and Regulation 5 of the Trout-fishing (Auckland) Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 1, are revoked, and the Schedule hereto substituted :—

Mangakahu, all streams within the boundaries of the Otorohanga County other than such streams as are specifically referred to in these regulations	Natural fly and artificial fly.
Waikato from the power-house and foot of the spillway at Arapuni to the Horahora spillway and power-house, Pokaiwhenua, that stretch of Lake Arapuni from a point 80 chains above the dam, Moakururu (down-stream from its junction with the Oamaru Stream), Awakino, down-stream from Mahoenui Bridge, Little Waipa and its tributaries, Mangatutu, Owairaka, Mangaotaki below the Pio Pio Bridge, Mangahoe (or Tawarau)	Artificial fly, artificial minnow, and spoon.
Waipa River above its junction with the Waitomo Stream	Natural fly, artificial fly, artificial minnow, and spoon.
Waipa River (below its junction with the Waitomo) Waitomo, Mangapu, Mangaorongo (below O'Briens Bridge), Ongarue (below Waimiha Railway-station), Waikato from the Horahora spillway and power-house to its mouth	Natural fly, artificial fly, natural minnow, artificial minnow, and spoon.
Waiomo and Whakauru Streams; the Waihou from the Oxford Bridge on the Tirau-Rotorua Road to Okoroire	Artificial fly and spoon.
