THE TROUT-FISHING (WAITAKI) REGULATIONS 1937, AMENDMENT NO. 4.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 1st day of October, 1941.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (Waitaki) Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 4.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Trout-fishing (Waitaki) Regulations 1937* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1941.

4. The provisoes to paragraph (a) of Regulation 6 of the principal regulations are revoked.

5. Regulation 4 of the Trout-fishing (Waitaki) Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 1, is consequentially revoked.

6. The principal regulations are amended by inserting therein. next after Regulation 12 thereof, the following additional regulations :-

"12A. During the period from the 1st day of October, 1941, to the 30th day of April, 1942 (both days inclusive), no person shall fish for trout or other acclimatized fish in that portion of the Oamaru Creek from the bridge at Severn Street to the waterfall at Meeks Mill.

Trout-fishing (Waitaki) Regulations 1937, [1941/174. Amendment No. 4.

"12B. No person other than the holder of a license issued to a woman or to a person under sixteen years of age shall fish for trout or other acclimatized fish in the Kakanui River with any steel trace or with any bait or lure other than artificial bait.

"12c. No person shall fish for trout or other acclimatized fish in the Ahuriri River, the Omarama Creek, and the other tributaries of the Ahuriri River with any bait or lure other than artificial bait."
