**THE TROUT-FISHING (AUCKLAND) REGULATIONS 1937,
AMENDMENT NO. 5.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 1st day of
October, 1941.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (Auckland) Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 5.
2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Trout-fishing (Auckland) Regulations 1937* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1941.
4. The respective regulations referred to in the First Schedule hereto are revoked.
5. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations, as amended by Regulation 5 of the Trout-fishing (Auckland) Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 2, is revoked and the following regulation substituted :—
“ 7. No person shall in fishing for trout in any river specified in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto use any bait or lure other than a bait or lure specified against the name of that river in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto.”

6. Regulation 12 of the principal regulations, as amended by Regulation 5 of the Trout-fishing (Auckland) Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 3, is revoked and the following regulation substituted:—

“ 12. (a) During the period from the 1st day of October, 1941, to the 30th day of September, 1944 (both days inclusive), no person shall fish for, take, or kill trout by any means whatsoever in any of the waters mentioned in clause (b) of this regulation being waters in which trout fry have been placed.

“ (b) The waters referred to in clause (a) of this regulation are—

“ (1) The Little Waipa River from Pearce's Falls to its mouth :

“ (2) The tributaries of the Little Waipa River from Pearce's Falls to its mouth :

“ (3) The Mangare River :

“ (4) The Puriri River :

“ (5) The Waitete River :

“ Provided that where portion only of a river is included in this clause the tributaries thereof so included shall be deemed to be only those tributaries the confluence of which with the river is within that portion of the river included in this clause.”
