THE TELEGRAPH REGULATIONS 1939, AMENDMENT NO. 2.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 10th day of
January, 1940.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Telegraph Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 2.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Telegraph Regulations 1939* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April, 1940.

4. Regulation 2 : 6-4 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted :—

“ 2 : 6-4. The charges for the registration of a code indicator as a code address shall be as follows :—

“ Yearly registration fee—

“ (a) For oversea telegrams and radio-telegrams	£1 10s.
“ (b) For inland telegrams	£1 10s.
“ (c) For inland and oversea telegrams and radio-telegrams	£2

“ Minimum registration fee (for a period of three months or less)—

“ (a) For oversea telegrams and radio-telegrams	7s. 6d.
“ (b) For inland telegrams	7s. 6d.
“ (c) For inland and oversea telegrams and radio-telegrams	10s.”
