ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 10th day of January, 1940.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Telegraph Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 2.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Telegraph Regulations 1939* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April, 1940.
- 4. Regulation 2:6-4 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted:
- "2:6-4. The charges for the registration of a code indicator as a code address shall be as follows:---
