THE TROUT-FISHING (GREY) REGULATIONS 1943

Pursuant to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

Preliminary

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (Grey) Regulations 1943.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with the Fresh-water Fisheries Regulations 1936* (hereinafter called the general regulations).
- 3. The regulations made on the 13th day of August, 1928, and published in the *Gazette* on the 16th day of the same month at page 2467, relating to fishing in the Grey Acclimatization District, are revoked.

OPEN SEASON

- 4. The close season in the Grey Acclimatization District (hereinafter called the district) during which it shall be unlawful for any person to take, buy, sell, or have in possession any acclimatized fish other than trout, or in any way to injure or disturb the same, shall commence on the 1st day of May in every year and extend to the following 30th day of September, both days inclusive.
- 5. Pursuant to section 93 of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and on the written application in that behalf of the Grey Acclimatization Society, the date for the commencement of the close season for trout-fishing in the district is fixed as being the 1st day of April in every year, and the duration of the said close season is hereby fixed at five months—that is to say, until the 31st day of August in every year, both days inclusive.

DISTRICT RESTRICTIONS

- 6. No person shall, in fishing for any acclimatized fish in the district, use any lure or bait other than a natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow, silveries, bullies, grasshoppers, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, or worms.
- 7. Except as permitted by the general regulations and these regulations, no person shall fish with or use any net, or any instrument, or device, or means for taking trout, or other acclimatized fish in any waters within the district:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the placing of any net other than a stake net in or across the mouth of the Grey River, or at any place in the said river below a straight line drawn across the said river opposite Tainui Street, in the Town of Greymouth, for the purpose of taking indigenous fish only, or render any person liable to a penalty for so doing.

PENALTY

8. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £50.
