THE TELEPHONE REGULATIONS 1950, AMENDMENT NO. 1

THE HON. K. J. HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Telephone Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telephone Regulations 1950* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Regulation 75 of the principal regulations is hereby amended as follows :—

(a) By omitting from subclause (1) the reference in the table of charges set out therein to the item "Intercommunicating extension telephone (P.B.X.)" and also by omitting the charges prescribed in the table in respect of that item :

(b) By revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause :—

"(2) The subscriber shall be required to pay the cost of the labour and incidental expenses involved in removing to another location, whether in the same premises or in other premises, the following classes of equipment :—

"(a) An interphone key-box ;

"(b) An interphone system ;

"(c) An intercommunicating extension telephone ; or

"(d) Private branch exchange switching equipment."

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 151, and substituting the following regulation :—

“ 151. If any person uses the public telephone at a toll station for the purpose of—

“(a) Conversing over a private telephone line connected with the toll station ; or

“(b) Communicating with a subscriber’s station of an exchange, the base rate area of which includes the site on which the toll station is situated,—

a charge of 2d. shall be payable for the communication.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*]

Regulation 2 provides that the actual cost of the labour and other expenses involved in removing intercommunicating extension telephones or equipment shall be paid by the subscriber instead of a prescribed charge.

Regulation 3 provides for the omission of redundant words and does not alter practice hitherto followed.
