THE TUBERCULOSIS REGULATIONS 1951, AMENDMENT NO. 1

PURSUANT to the Tuberculosis Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Tuberculosis Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Tuberculosis Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.

2. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "a fee of 3s. 6d.", and substituting the words "a fee of 5s.".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Under section 3 of the Tuberculosis Act 1948 every medical practitioner who has reason to believe that any patient attended by him is or may be suffering from tuberculosis or who becomes aware that any deceased person was suffering from tuberculosis must give notice in the prescribed form to the Medical Officer of Health. These regulations increase the fee payable for each notification under that section from 3s. 6d. to 5s.
