**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 25th day of September 1972

Present:

**HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to the Tuberculosis Act 1948, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Tuberculosis Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Tuberculosis Regulations 1951\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1973.

**2. Revocation**—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulations 15, 16, 17, and 18.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1973, remove an obligation imposed on tuberculosis officers and Hospital Boards to send certain reports and notices to the Medical Officer of Health.
