**THE TRAFFIC REGULATIONS 1956, AMENDMENT NO. 9**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 17th day of December 1963

Present:

**THE HON. J. R. MARSHALL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to the Transport Act 1962, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Traffic Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 9, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Traffic Regulations 1956\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) Regulation 121 of the principal regulations is hereby amended—

- (a) By inserting in subclause (14), after the words “NO STOPPING”, the words “or the words ‘NO STANDING’”;
- (b) By inserting in subclause (14), after the words “on stopping”, the words “or standing”.

(2) The Fourth Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to the form of Diagram No. 12 the following words:

“The words ‘NO STANDING’ may be substituted for the words ‘NO STOPPING’.”

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations enable the words “NO STANDING” to be used on signs of Class G (“NO STOPPING” signs) as an alternative to the words “NO STOPPING”.
