ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 13th day of February 1967

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Telephone Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telephone Regulations 1961* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1967.

2. Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a) of subclause (1), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(a) State and registered private primary and post-primary schools.”
