Pursuant to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Telephone Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telephone Regulations 1961* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1967.
- 2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule thereto, and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) Regulation 3 of the Telephone Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 1, the Telephone Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 2, and regulation 3 of the Telephone Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 3, are hereby revoked.

If the connection is later made permanent a service connection fee becomes payable, and the foregoing costs are refunded less the value of any temporary material rendered unusable in so doing.

When an extension telephone or other item of miscellaneous equipment is installed in a subscriber's premises situated beyond the boundary of the base rate area the subscriber shall pay, in addition to the installation charge, the cost of the workmen's travelling time and expenses, assessed at the rate of 2s. 0d. a mile or fraction thereof, for one return trip between the boundary of the base rate area and the subscriber's premises. This additional charge is not made when the installation of an extension telephone or other item of miscellaneous equipment is undertaken in conjunction with the installation of the main telephone.

(b) For each minute or fraction thereof exceeding the initial period of three minutes for distances over 30 miles the charge is one-third of the initial charge.

- (3) (a) Urgent calls: double the charge for an ordinary call plus the prescribed charges for any special services.

 - The charge for a series of contract calls is the ordinary charge less 10 percent.
