

# THE TELEPHONE REGULATIONS 1961, AMENDMENT NO. 6 

BERNARD FERGUSSON, Governor-General<br>ORDER IN COUNGIL<br>At the Government House at Wellington this 5th day of July 1967

Present:
His Excellency the Governor-General in Council
Pursuant to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the GovernorGeneral, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Telephone Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telephone Regulations 1961* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 10th day of July 1967.
2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule thereto (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Telephone Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 5) and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
(2) The Telephone Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 5, are hereby revoked.

When an extension telephone or other item of miscellaneous equipment is installed in a subscriber's premises situated beyond the boundary of the base rate area or special rate area the subscriber shall pay, in addition to the installation charge, the cost of the workmen's travelling time and expenses, assessed at the rate of 20 c a mile or fraction thereof, for one return trip between the boundary of the base rate area or special rate area and the subscriber's premises. This additional charge is not made when the installation of an extension telephone or other item of miscellaneous equipment is undertaken in conjunction with the installation of the main telephone.

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations express the rates of telephone charges in decimal currency.

    **Covered by prescribed charge for a new connection, new extension, extension bell, or change in type of telephone. Labour and incidental costs are payable when these telephones are installed on intercommunicating systems or leased-direct circuits. Any conduit and tiles required are at the cost of the subscriber.
