



## THE TELEGRAPH REGULATIONS 1967, AMENDMENT NO. 5

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 10th day of December  
1973

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Telegraph Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telegraph Regulations 1967\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Ordinary telegrams**—Regulation 4 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Telegraph Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 2) is hereby amended by inserting in the definition of the expression “public holiday” in subclause (1), after the words “the second day of January,”, the words “New Zealand Day,”.

**3. Press telegrams**—Regulation 20 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Telegraph Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 4) is hereby amended by inserting in the heading above paragraph (e) of the table, after the words “*the 2nd day of January*,”, the words “*New Zealand Day*,”.
