



THE TELEPHONE REGULATIONS 1976, AMENDMENT NO. 10

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day of September 1982

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Telephone Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telephone Regulations 1976* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1982.

2. First Schedule—(1) Part III of the First Schedule to the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Telephone Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 8) is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1) of clause 1, and substituting the new subclause (1) set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Part III of the First Schedule to the principal regulations (as so substituted) is hereby further amended by revoking paragraph (i) of clause 10 (a), and substituting the new paragraph (i) set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations come into force on 1 October 1982 and prescribe installation and rental charges for three new additions to the range of electronic P.A.B.X.'s. All previously existing charges remain unchanged.
