# THE TELEPHONE REGULATIONS 1976, AMENDMENT NO. 2

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 13th day of March 1978

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Telephone Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telephone Regulations 1976\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. Minister may discontinue telephone service—Regulation 64 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding, after paragraph (c), the following paragraph:

"(d) If in the opinion of the Minister any wilful activity by a subscriber so affects the telephone system that the use of the

system by other people is seriously inhibited."

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

This amendment empowers the Minister to discontinue the telephone service of any subscriber whose wilful activity seriously inhibits the use of the telephone system by other people.
