



## THE TELEPHONE REGULATIONS 1976, AMENDMENT NO. 7

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 27th day of October 1981

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Telephone Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 7, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telephone Regulations 1976\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November 1981.

**2. Outer area charges**—Regulation 29 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words “in the outer area”, the words “The chargeable distance for that part of the circuit which uses a radio system shall be assessed on the basis of the ‘line of sight’ plus 10 percent.”

**3. First Schedule**—(1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 10 (1) of the Telephone Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 4) is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1) of clause 1 of Part III, and substituting the new subclause set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The First Schedule to the principal regulations (as so substituted) is hereby further amended by revoking clause 10 of Part III, and substituting the new clause set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

(3) The First Schedule to the principal regulations (as so substituted) is hereby further amended by omitting from paragraph (c) of Part IV the expression “41.00”, and substituting the expression “25.00”.

(4) The First Schedule to the principal regulations (as so substituted) is hereby further amended by repealing paragraph (n) of Part IV, and substituting the new paragraph set out in the Third Schedule to these regulations.

#### NEW SUBCLAUSE (1) TO CLAUSE 1 OF PART III OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE TO THE PRINCIPAL REGULATIONS

“(1) For new P.A.B.X. or P.M.B.X. systems the following installation charges shall be payable:

<sup>‡</sup>For circuit charges associated with distant extension telephones and tie lines refer to the S1 rate prescribed in the Leased Circuit and Leased Apparatus Regulations 1976.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations provide the formula for calculating certain circuit charges relating to telephone services and for charges for electronic P.A.B.X. systems, reduce the rental for loud-speaking telephones, and provide for separate rentals for various models of repertory diallers.
