ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 26th day of January 1982

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Telephone Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telephone Regulations 1976* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) Subject to subclause (3) of this regulation, these regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of February 1982.
- (3) All rental charges included in the Schedule to these regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1982.
- 2. First Schedule—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule (as substituted by regulation 10 of the Telephone Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 4, and amended by regulation 4 of the Telephone Regulations, Amendment No. 6 and

PART I

SERVICE CONNECTION FEES

1. Service connection, reconnection, and transfer fees—The

following fees are payable for connection, reconnection, and transfer of services: \$ (a) For service connection (Reg. 5) 100 Provided that the fee is reducible in the following circumstances: (i) If the internal wiring and outside circuit to the polehead or cable terminal are in position from a former connection and only a telephone instrument is to be installed in the original position 60 (ii) If the telephone instrument, wiring, and outside circuit to the polehead or cable terminal are in position from a former connection ... 25 (iii) If, in the circumstances outlined in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the new lessee does not require a change in the directory listing the service connection fee is not payable: (b) For reconnection (Reg. 40) ... 25 (c) For transferring an existing exchange connection (Reg. 25 Provided that no charge shall be made if-(i) There is no change in the user of the telephone even though a change in the directory listing is required; or (ii) The new lessee does not require a change in the

directory listing.

- (2) B1 and B2 subscribers at Class 2 automatic exchanges shall pay Class 1 rentals.
- 2. Special rate area charges (Reg. 28)—The following additional 2-monthly charges which are applicable to main station connections within a special rate area shall be payable:

(a) For a business subscriber \$4.65 (b) For a residential subscriber \$2.25

- 3. Outer area charges (Reg. 29)—The following 2-monthly charges which are applicable to main station connections beyond the boundary of a base rate area or special rate area, shall be payable:
 - (a) For an individual line, \$1.20 per 200 metres or part for the first 5 kilometres; 60c per 200 metres or part thereafter:
 - (b) For a 2-party line, 60c per 200 metres or part for the first 5 kilometres; 34c per 200 metres or part thereafter:

- (c) For a 3-party to 5-party line, 18c per 200 metres or part for the first 5 kilometres; 34c per kilometre or part thereafter up to and including 30 kilometres, 25c per kilometre or part thereafter:
- (d) For a 6-party to 10-party line, 67c per kilometre or part for the first 5 kilometres; 34c per kilometre or part thereafter up to and including 30 kilometres; 25c per kilometre or part thereafter.
- 4. Foreign Exchange Service (Reg. 30)—(1) The 2-monthly charges payable in respect of the foreign exchange service shall be as determined by the base rate area charge for the exchange from which service is provided plus the Main Line circuit rate for the distance from the exchange from which service is given to the exchange normally servicing the subscriber's premises, as prescribed in the Leased Circuit and Leased Apparatus Regulations 1976. In multi-exchange and free-calling areas the circuit distance is measured from the central exchange of the free-calling area from which service is obtained.
- (2) For 2-party service each subscriber will pay 75 percent of the total individual rental.
 - (3) In addition a connection fee of \$125 is payable for each trunk line.
- **5. Message rate station service (Reg. 31)**—(1) The 2-monthly rental for a message rate station service shall be \$13.00.
- (2) In addition the subscriber is required to pay call fees at the rate prescribed for toll calls.
- **6. Temporary telephone service (Reg. 71)**—(1) For the provision of temporary telephone service the appropriate connection fee is payable.
- (2) The rental for each temporary telephone shall be 25% per week of the appropriate 2-monthly rental with a minimum charge as for 2 weeks.
- 7. Joint use of telephone (Reg. 72)—The following additional 2-monthly rental shall be payable for joint use of a telephone:

(a) For a business main station \$9.70 (b) For a residence main station \$4.50

- **8. Subscribers' coin-box service (Reg. 70)**—(1) For the installation of a subscribers' coin-box, a charge of \$33 is payable.
- (2) The 2-monthly charge additional to that payable for a main station or extension station telephone service is \$10.
- (3) No installation charge is payable if the coin-box is installed at the same time as the telephone with which it is associated.

9. Amplifying telephones (Reg. 88)—(1) The following charges are payable in respect of amplifying telephones:

- (2) The subscriber shall arrange with a private contractor for the provision of the wiring and power outlet socket for the alternating current supply if required.
- (3) No charge shall be made for installing an amplifying telephone if the work is done at the same time as the associated main or extension station is installed
- *This charge is not payable if signalling device is installed at same time as the amplifying telephone.
 †For each installation after the first, in the same premises at the same time, a 50 percent reduction shall apply to the installation charge.
- 10. Voice recording apparatus and telephone answering machines (Reg. 87)—For the connection or changing to another line of any voice recording apparatus or telephone answering machine a fee of \$40* is payable.
- *For each connection or change after the first, in the same premises at the same time, a 50 percent reduction shall apply to the charge.
- 11. Non-standard telephones (Reg. 86)—(1) The following additional 2-monthly rentals are payable in respect of non-standard telephones:

(2) Installation fees covered by prescribed charge for a new connection, new extension or change in type of telephone. Labour and incidental costs are payable when these telephones are installed on intercommunicating systems or leased circuits. Any conduit and tiles required are at the cost of the subscriber.

- 12. Subscriber-controlled diversion service (Reg. 89)—The following charges are payable in respect of the subscriber-controlled diversion service:
 - (a) For facilities to divert incoming calls to a second subscriber's station—
 - (i) An installation fee of \$100.
 - (ii) A 2-monthly rental at the V1 rate prescribed in the Leased Circuit and Leased Apparatus Regulations 1976 is payable for the distance of the control circuit to the exchange.

(NOTE: On payment of charges on the same basis, the second subscriber can obtain facilities to divert his calls to the first subscriber's station.)

- (b) For facilities to divert his incoming calls to 2 or more selected subscribers' stations one at a time—
 - (i) An initial installation fee equal to the actual costs, or \$100, whichever is the greater. A similar fee is payable for each subsequent occasion when additional facilities are requested.
 - (ii) A 2-monthly rental at the V1 rate prescribed in the Leased Circuit and Leased Apparatus Regulations 1976 is payable in respect of each physical pair utilised for the control circuits to the exchange.

7. Installation charges for interphone systems—(1) For the installation of an interphone system, a charge of \$90 is payable in respect of each new or additional key box installed.

(2) For the installation of a holding and secrecy device a fee of \$33* is

payable.

(3) No charge shall be made for holding and secrecy devices when they are installed at the same time as the system or key box.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the telephone charges. The new rental charges are to come into effect on 1 April 1982 and the other charges on 1 February 1982.
