



## THE TELEGRAPH REGULATIONS 1977, AMENDMENT NO. 2

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 3rd day of March 1980

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Telegraph Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telegraph Regulations 1977\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Facsimile service**—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 15, the following regulation:

“15A. (1) Drawings, or typed, printed, or hand-written matter may be lodged for transmission and delivery on facsimile equipment at public facsimile stations under the control of the Minister.

“(2) The charge for this service within New Zealand shall be—

“(a) For processing, \$1.40 for the first page and 60c for each additional page of the same document; and

“(b) For delivery of each complete document (within the prescribed delivery boundary of the office of destination), \$1.60; and

“(c) For collection of a document from a customer's premises (within the prescribed delivery boundary of the office of transmission), \$1.60.

“(3) The charges for handling international facsimile communications shall be at such rates as may from time to time be fixed by the Minister.”

These regulations provide for the transmission of documents by public facsimile stations.
