THE TIMBER-WORKERS REGISTRATION ORDER 1942

Pursuant to Regulation 9c of the National Service Emergency Regulations 1940,* the Minister of National Service doth hereby order and direct as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Timber-workers Registration Order 1942.
- 2. Subject to the exemptions hereinafter specified, every male person who at the date of this Order is a member of the General Reserve constituted by Regulation 5 of the National Service Emergency Regulations 1940†, and who within the last fifteen years has been employed for an aggregate period of twelve months or more in any sawmill or wooden-box factory or in any work involved in timberfelling or timber-splitting or firewood-cutting or in the transporting of logs to any sawmill, shall within seven days after the date of this Order register for employment by completing a form provided for the purpose and delivering it to a District Man-power Officer either personally or by registered post.
- 3. Subject to the exemptions hereinafter specified, every male person who at any time after the date of this Order becomes a member of the General Reserve and who within the fifteen years immediately preceding that time has been employed for an aggregate period of twelve months or more in any sawmill or wooden-box factory, or in any work involved in timber-felling or timber-splitting or firewood-cutting, or in the transporting of logs to any sawmill shall within seven days thereafter register for employment in the manner prescribed in clause 2 hereof.
- 4. Every person who for the time being belongs to any one or more of the classes specified in the Schedule hereto shall be exempt from compliance with clause 2 or clause 3 of this Order.
- 5. If at any time after the date of this Order any person ceases to be exempted under the last preceding clause from compliance with clause 2 or clause 3 of this Order, he shall within seven days thereafter register for employment in the manner prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

SCHEDULE.

EXEMPTIONS.

Persons who have not attained the age of eighteen years.

Persons who have attained the age of sixty-six years.

Persons registered or deemed to be registered for the purposes of Regulation 9c of the National Service Emergency Regulations 1940.

Persons rendering continuous service as members of His Majesty's naval, military, or air forces.

Persons serving in merchant ships.

Persons who are outside New Zealand.

Persons in receipt of invalids' benefits under the Social Security Act, 1938.

Persons in receipt of war pensions for disablement assessed at not less than 75 per cent. which has arisen from service in any of His Majesty's naval, military, or air forces.

Inmates of any hospital or of the New Zealand Institute for the Blind.

Persons in respect of whom reception-orders are in force under the Mental Defectives Act, 1911 (whether or not they are detained in institutions under that Act), or who are detained as voluntary boarders under that Act.

Persons undergoing sentences of imprisonment or detained in Borstal institutions.
