REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Telecommunications (International Services) Amendment Regulations 1999, and are part of the Telecommunications (International Services) Regulations 1994\* (“the principal regulations”).

(2) These regulations come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Conditions of registration**—Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking paragraph (c).

**3. Fees in respect of registration**—Regulation 9 of the principal regulations is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, revoke regulations 6(c) and 9 of the Telecommunications (International Services) Regulations 1994.

The effect of the amendments is to revoke the requirement for registered operators to pay an annual registration fee of \$10,000.
