HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Machinery Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Tractor Safety Frame Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Tractor Safety Frame Regulations 1967* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Certificate of approval—(1) Regulation 6 (2) of the principal regulations (as amended by the Tractor Safety Frame Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 2) is hereby further amended by revoking paragraph (b) (as substituted by regulation 2 (1) of the Tractor Safety Frame Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the following paragraph:

"(b) A fee of \$10."

(2) Form 5 in the First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby consequentially amended by omitting the expression "\$6" (as substituted by regulation 2 (2) of the Tractor Safety Frame Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the expression "\$10".
