



## Transport (Breath Tests) Amendment Notice 2002

Pursuant to sections 2 and 218 of the Land Transport Act 1998, the Minister of Police gives the following notice.

### Notice

#### 1 Title

- (1) This notice is the Transport (Breath Tests) Amendment Notice 2002.
- (2) In this notice, the Transport (Breath Tests) Notice (No 2) 1989<sup>1</sup> is called “the principal notice”.

#### 2 Commencement

This notice comes into force on 1 November 2002.

#### 3 Interpretation

Clause 2(1) of the principal notice is amended by revoking the definition of **Seres**, and substituting the following definition:

“**Seres** means a Seres Ethylometre model 679T or a Seres Ethylometre model 679ENZ; and includes any device having the trade name ‘Seres’ and associated with the number 679.”

### Explanatory note

*This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This notice, which comes into force on 1 November 2002, amends the Transport (Breath Tests) Notice (No 2) 1989 (“the principal notice”).

The definition of the term **Seres** in the principal notice is amended to include a device called the Seres Ethylometre model 679ENZ. Under the principal notice, the Seres is an evidential breath-testing device within the meaning of that term in section 2(1) of the Land Transport Act 1998.
