**THE TEACHERS TRAINING COLLEGE REGULATIONS 1959,  
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 30th day of January 1963

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Teachers Training College Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Teachers Training College Regulations 1959\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:

“(1) For the purpose of demonstrating good modern educational practice, there shall be affiliated with each teachers college one or more normal schools. A normal school shall include—

“(a) A main school which may be a full primary school, a contributing school, or an intermediate school:

“(b) Model schools of such number and type as may be approved by the Director:

“Provided that, where the Minister in view of local circumstances so approves, a normal school may consist solely of a full primary school, a contributing school, or an intermediate school. In any such case, the Director shall select one or more public schools in reasonable proximity to the normal school to be attached to that school as model schools, and the teaching staff of those public schools shall then be deemed to form part of the staff of the normal school.”

(2) Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by inserting in subclause (3), after the words “In addition to the model schools included in”, the words “or attached to”.

3. Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a) of subclause (4).

4. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 14, and substituting the following regulation:

“14. To be admitted to a teachers college in Division A or Division H, an applicant must, before his admission, have been accredited for entrance to University or have passed the Entrance Examination of the Universities Entrance Board, or (having been awarded the School Certificate) have had that Certificate endorsed to show that he has thereafter satisfactorily completed an advanced course of instruction for one year, or have obtained some other educational qualification that in the opinion of the Director is equivalent thereto:

“Provided that in the year 1963 an applicant may be admitted to a teachers college in Division A or Division H if, before his admission, he passed the School Certificate Examination; and an applicant may be so admitted in the year 1964 if he passed the School Certificate Examination in the year 1961 or in any earlier year.”

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations provide that a public school may be attached to a normal school without being included in that school, thus enabling the public school to retain its school committee. The regulations also vary the rules governing the admission of students to a teachers training college.
