THE TRANSPORT (FARMERS' TRACTOR) EMERGENCY ORDER 1942

1. This Order may be cited as the Transport (Farmers' Tractor) Emergency Order 1942.

2. The Transport Legislation Suspension Order 1941[†] is hereby revoked.

3. In this Order the term "road" means any public road, and includes a street.

4. The provisions of section 11 of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, are hereby suspended so far as they require the payment of annual license fees in respect of any tractor or any trailer drawn by a tractor if the vehicle—

- (a) Is owned by a person carrying on business as a farmer and is used exclusively in connection with the owner's farming business; and
- (b) Is used on roads only for the cartage of milk or whey to or from a dairy factory, or for the cartage of lime or other fertilizer, or for agricultural purposes, or for all or any of those purposes; and
- (c) Is not taken during any one trip for the cartage of lime or other fertilizer along more than thirteen miles of road in going from the owner's farm or other place of garage and in returning thereto.
