

THE TAUPO TROUT FISHING REGULATIONS 1950, AMENDMENT NO. 2

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908 and section 14 of the Maori Land Amendment and Maori Land Claims Adjustment Act 1926, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Taupo Trout Fishing Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Taupo Trout Fishing Regulations 1950* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Regulation 43 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (b) of subclause (5), and substituting the following subparagraph:—

"(iii) Commencing at the point of land on the eastern side of Whangamata Bay at the place known as the 'Willows', as indicated by a landmark, and following the eastern and northern shores of the said bay to a point, as indicated by a landmark, 400 yards west of the point where the Otaketake Stream enters the lake: ".

3. Regulation 44 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:—

"(d) That portion of the Hinemaiai River which is between the Taupo hydro electric supply dam and its source, including the lake formed by the dam, and all tributaries of that portion of that river."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations modify the local areas in which the restrictions on places and methods of fishing prescribed by regulations 43 and 44 of the principal regulations are to operate.
