**THE UNIVERSITY BURSARIES REGULATIONS 1971,

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 27th day of November 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title**—These regulations may be cited as the University Bursaries Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the University Bursaries Regulations 1971\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

**2. Boarding allowance**—(1) Regulation 20 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (1) the expression "\$300", and substituting the expression "\$350".

(2) The said regulation is hereby further amended by omitting from subclause (2) the expression "\$300", and substituting the expression "\$350".

(3) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (1) or subclause (2) of this regulation, in the year 1972 the maximum value of each boarding allowance payable under the principal regulations shall be \$316.67.

**3. Usual period of tenure**—The principal regulations are hereby further amended by adding to regulation 23 the following proviso: "Provided that a bursary in respect of the course for the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery of the University of Auckland shall be tenable for a period of not more than 2 years."

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations increase the maximum value of certain boarding allowances payable under the University Bursaries Regulations 1971 from \$300 to \$316.67 for the year 1972, and thereafter to \$350. Express provision is made for the usual tenure of a bursary in respect of the course for the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery of the University of Auckland to be not more than 2 years.
